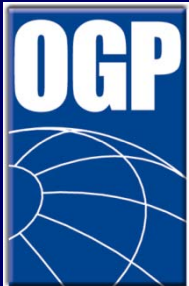

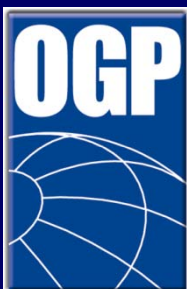

Who are the OGP?

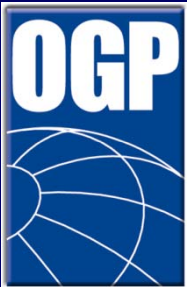
The International Association of Oil & Gas Producers encompasses the world's leading private and state-owned oil & gas companies, their national and regional associations, and major upstream contractors and suppliers

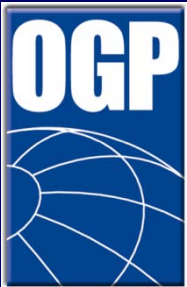
Objectives of Group

- Remove Client fragmentation through organisation and standardisation
- Agree on baseline requirements for diving
- Give a unified approach to external bodies
- Identify key areas for improvement
- Use group to drive improvements in safety



Overview OGP Diving Operations Sub Committee (DOSC)

- Diving Discipline Members of Oil & Gas Producers.
- Meets twice a year, normally hosted by an OGP member, last meeting KL (Petronas), next meetings, February- Houston (Exxon) and July, Anchorage (BP).
- Identifies areas for focus and initiates a working group or task force.
- Task force produces a Terms of Reference and solicits membership from industry
- OGP report produced

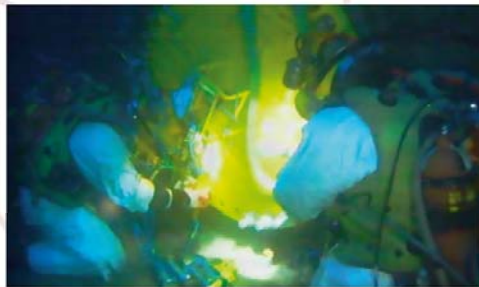

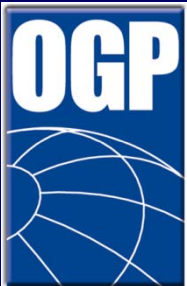

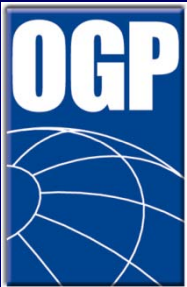
OGP Diving Industry Working Group

- Chair & 1 vice Chair supplied from DOSC
- 2 Vice Chairs from contractors – currently Mike Brown (Epic) & Steve MacMillan (JRM)
- Core invited Membership comprises of Global Diving Contractors, Trade Associations (IMCA & ADCI)& Class
- Meets twice a year following DOSC. Local diving contractors invited from region that the meeting is held in



Current Areas of Focus

- Oxy Arc Task force (Task Force Complete)
- Hyperbaric evacuation – identify parameters to be achieved by industry
- Client diving equipment auditing template-
 - Competence of auditor's and dive system assessment personnel
 - Use and control of PLC's [inc. competence]
 - Hyperbaric evacuation systems
 - Arctic/cold water conditions

Inland/nearshore diving safety workshop

8th March 2012, Houston

A lack of awareness by client organisations is frequently resulting in diving contractors winning work by compromising safety.

Inland/nearshore diving carried out inside territorial waters (normally within 12 miles or 19.25 kilometres from shore) continues to result in high levels of fatalities each year. Many of these could be prevented by following simple safety principles.

The workshop is relevant for activities carried out in docks, harbours, canals, culverts, rivers, estuaries, lakes, reservoirs, dams, flooded tunnels, tanks, refineries & terminals and also ship husbandry.

This workshop aims to:

- Raise the understanding amongst end users of key control elements of the OGP Diving Recommended Practice (Report Number 411).
- Achieve a global step change in improving diver safety.

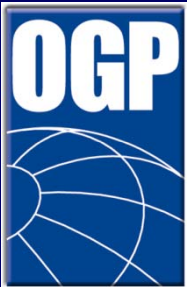

Process for delivery

- Create Task Force
- Task Force delivers to DOSC
- DOSC approves guidance to Safety Committee
- Safety Committee endorses guidance
- OGP publishes guidance
- DOSC members agree process and timeline for implementation
